# **Installation Instructions**

**NOTE**: Read the entire instruction manual before starting the installation.

## INTRODUCTION

This kit supplies the gasketing required in order to replace the gaskets on the doors and the top and bottom plate.

## **DESCRIPTION AND USAGE**

This gasket can replace any of the gaskets that are located on the door sides, door centers, the top plate and/or the bottom plate. See Table 1 for kit contents with either strips or rolls. Table 2 has all the lengths of the gaskets needed to replace the original gaskets.

## **INSTALLATION**

## **Unit Shut Down**

- 1. Set room thermostat to lowest setting or "OFF".
- 2. Disconnect power at external disconnect, fuse or circuit breaker.
- 3. Turn off gas at external shut-off or gas meter.
- 4. Remove outer doors and set aside.
- 5. Turn electric switch on gas valve to "OFF".

#### **Door Gasket Installation**

- Side gaskets are placed from the top edge to the bottom edge of the door. See Fig. 4.
- Center gasket should be placed inside of side gaskets. See Fig. 3 for placement.
- Gaskets should be offset 1/16<sup>th</sup> of an inch (1.5mm) from the edge of the hem as shown in Fig. 2.
- Gaskets should be in contact with both the hem and the flat surface along the edge of the door.
  - 1. Remove as much original gasket material as possible.
  - 2. Determine what length of gasket to cut by using Table 2.
  - Remove backing from gasket and apply to door using the guidelines stated above.

#### **Top Plate Gasket Installation**

- Gasket should be placed flush with the front flange of the top plate, and should be laid on top of the top plate insulation.
- Gasket should stretch the entire width of the furnace in between the front casing flanges.
  - Remove as much original gasket material as possible. Gasketing that is trapped in between the casing and the top plate does not need to be removed.
  - 2. Determine what length of gasket to cut by using Table 2.
  - Remove backing from gasket and apply to top plate using the guidelines stated above.

### **Bottom Plate Gasket Installation**

- Gasket should be placed flush with the front flange of the bottom plate.
- Gasket should stretch the entire width of the furnace in between the front casing flanges.
  - Remove as much original gasket material as possible. Gasketing that is trapped in between the casing and the bottom plate does not need to be removed.
- 2. Determine what length of gasket to cut by using Table 2.
- Remove backing from gasket and apply to top plate using the guidelines stated above.

#### **Unit Checkout**

**NOTE**: As part of the system check-out, verify that the following conditions are not affecting the operation of the furnace:

- Short Cycling-Defective thermostat: Incorrect thermostat anticipator setting, dirty filter or over-sized furnace.
- Under firing/low btu input: Set manifold pressure and verify firing rate as shown on rating plate by clocking the gas meter.
- Over-firing/high btu input: Set manifold pressure and verify firing rate as shown on rating plate by clocking the gas meter.
- Low temperature rise: Set unit for correct temperature rise range as shown on unit rating plate.
- Contaminated combustion air: Remove contaminates or provide ample fresh air for combustion.
- Excessive amounts of outside ventilation air: Return air temperature cannot be below 60 degrees F for extended periods of time.
- Incorrect venting or termination: Recirculation of products of combustion into the combustion air pipe can damage the furnace. Verify proper venting and vent termination per installation instructions. For additional information, and a complete sequence of furnace operation, refer to furnace Installation, Start-Up and Operating Instructions.
- Verify furnace operates properly and set thermostat to desired room temperature.

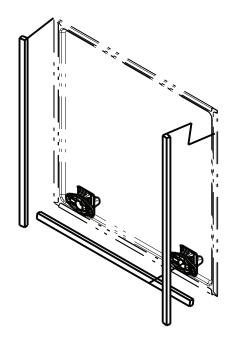


Fig. 1 - Exploded View of Door Gaskets (Door contents and features will vary)

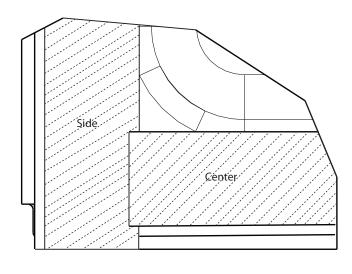


Fig. 3 - Proper Gasket Placement in Door Corners

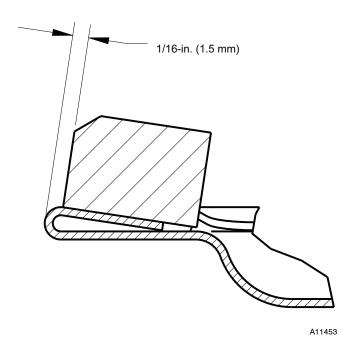


Fig. 2 - Proper Gasket Placement on Door Hem

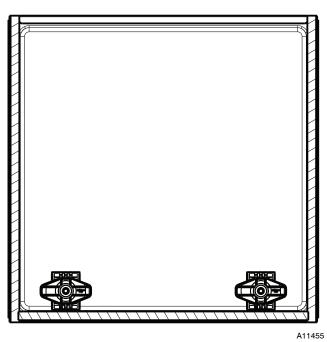


Fig. 4 - Assembled Door with Gaskets
